

## **Oliver Stone's 'W.' to film in Shreveport**

Shreveport has lured another major feature film production.

"W." is in preproduction and will begin shooting April 21 and likely wrap June 20, according to Louisiana's Office of Entertainment Industry Development. "W." will star Josh Brolin as President George W. Bush and will be directed by Oliver Stone, according to the Internet Movie Database.

Brolin earned acclaim in 2007 for his roles in "No Country for Old Men," "In the Valley of Elah" and "American Gangster."

Stone, a Hollywood icon, directed "Platoon," "Nixon," "JFK," "Wall Street," "World Trade Center" and "Alexander."

In January, Stone spoke about the project to Daily Variety.

"It's a behind-the-scenes approach, similar to 'Nixon,' to give a sense of what it's like to be in his skin," he told the trade publication. "But if 'Nixon' was a symphony, this is more like a chamber piece and not as dark in tone."

The production is accepting crew resumes, which can be faxed to (318) 603-9556.

"W." isn't the only project in Shreveport.

"Year One," starring Jack Black, will wrap production this week. "Tekken," a futuristic martial arts flick, will wrap Monday. "Beyond a Reasonable Doubt," starring Michael Douglas, will shoot through April 11.

According to the Office of Entertainment Industry Development, a feature film called "Goodie Two Shoes" is also in preproduction and scheduled for an April 28 start. Crew resumes can be faxed to (318) 682-5644.
